## **Pro Grant**

Our Pro Grant application was approved and we were granted \$2000 to put towards engagement events.

Based on community responses to Google Survey, focus of the Pro Grant submission is on Well-Being

Types of events that were approved are:

### **Fitness**

-two, 1 hour sessions for a family fitness class

-cricket, soccer, can we engage other community fitness agencies to attend and be present to provide information or skills development opportunities

### Nutrition

-branches of nutrition/sneaky healthy snacks/

-food to fuel – Possible Rooks to Crooks workshop

Can this be tied in with Earth Week activities and a Fairy Garden event similar to a Fall Harvest Day event with families decorating the front of the school? No volunteers to explore this idea yet.

#### Healthy minds and well-being/guest speakers/workshops for parents

-Discover your Inner Chef (Durham Region Health) is a possibility

-Admin has reached out to the public health nurse to see if she is able to partner with us and be involved in this event- waiting to hear back.

### Arts Night

Possible ideas.... Paint night or ceramics night

An SCC member asked if we would be holding all 4 events. Admin replied that volunteers are needed to plan, manage and attend the nights. Planning the events is a lot of work and is not possible without a team of volunteers working on them. Last year we held two events but the bulk
