Educator	Musical Instrument Repair The majority of our music (hand) instruments, purchased in 2010 when the school energy are			
Wishlist	The majority of our music (band) instruments, purchased in 2010 when the school opened, are starting to show their age after 13 years of use. While Mr Brown has been able to do many of the			
	minor repairs himself over the years, the repairs needed to certain instruments now are becoming			
	beyond his abilities. We have purchased a handful of new instruments over the years (including			
	some purchased with support of the SCC) which will eventually enter the same state over the next			
	couple years. Alternatively, the purchase of a couple of new instruments would help replace some			
	of the instruments no longer in working order (although this would not solve the issue of the many			
	instruments needing repair work).			
	Repairs - done through Long & McQuade, and cost approximately \$100 (minor) to \$200 (major) per			
	instrument fixed. There are probably up to 15 instruments that could use some repair (beyond Mr Brown's ability to do so) currently. New instruments, purchased using the DDSB equipment guide,			
	I brown a ability to do sol currently. New instruments, purchased using the DDSD equipment guide,			

	are at the following prices: Flutes - \$465, Clarinets - \$524, Alto Sax - \$1066.05, Tenor Sax - \$1555, Trumpets - \$481.05. As you can see, quite expensive, so repairs, if possible, are much more feasible. -Tricia H-G said we had invested heavily in musical instruments 5 or 6 years ago

With our school being as large as it is, it is tricky to outfit them all in WSPS gear at the same time. With larger teams and/or multiple teams running at the same time we do not have enough. Jerseys are not required for the above sports mentioned as they do not need numbers, just identification, and tshirts are an excellent and cost effective option. Having all students outfitted and not having to wear and then pass along to the next athlete will help with supervision, especially at a cross country meet with multiple students around. The shirts are a beautiful performance material with a bright whitby shores name and logo, wash well and can easily be transported, laundered, and stored for years to come. Shirts have not been purchased since close to the opening of our school (last purchase was approximately 10 years ago) and with the proper care our staff is willing to put forth, they will easily last 10 years into the future.
